## **Christmas Adoption Program**

We completed another successful Christmas Adoption Program in December! A total of 76 generous sponsors helped make the holidays a little less stressful for the families served.

160 families were served across six counties:



Allamakee - 47 families

Chickasaw - 12 families

Clayton - 1 family

Favette - 14 families

Howard - 17 families

Winneshiek - 69 families



#### **Transit**

Transit welcomed 29 new customers and assisted a total of 445 passengers with their transportation needs in December.

Throughout the month Transit made 5,065 trips, helping people get to medical appointments, work, school, and more!



#### Weatherization

In December, the Crew finished up a number of homes & completed maintenance work on insulation machines. Two staff attended statewide training on changes to WAP Standards and inspection process. A new web-based audit tool is in the works & staff will complete training as it's available.



#### **CACFP**

Our CACFP department is looking for In-Home Daycare Providers to join! To be eligible, a provider must have current lowa DHS Child Development Registration or be approved by lowa DHS as a Childcare Home & complete required health & safety inspections. ### Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program

#### In December 2023:

317 LiHEAP applications approved, for a total of \$165,520 in assistance.

12 ECIP applications approved, for a total of \$10,495.28 in assistance.

12 Crisis applications approved, for a total of \$3,946.92 in assistance.

#### **FaDSS**

In the first half of the program's fiscal year, 13 families exited the program. Of those families:



Had increased income at program exit



Of those with children ages 0-5 co-enrolled in early childhood programs



Of employed FaDSS families with childcare issues that were addressed

100% of adult & child family members with mental health barriers accessed treatment

100% of families who screened positive for domestic violence were refrerred for assistance

### **Family Services**

Our Family Services Specialists linked over 350 households to additional services in December.

Referrals were made to the following resources, along with MANY others: WIC, Upper Explorerland, Trinity Helping Services, lowa HHS, Friends of the Family, community food shelves, Shepherd of the Hills, Green lowa AmeriCorps and more!
