Family Services & Crisis Programs

NEICAC food pantries served 515 unduplicated individuals, providing 12,889 pounds of food. Our local and county crisis assistance programs provided \$28,024 in assistance to 73 families in need. This included preventing and reconnecting utility disconnections, evictions, and car repairs.



Early Childhood Programs

Early Head Start has Twenty-Eight threeyear-old children transitioning out of the program in August. In April EHS Home Visitors and parents completed 1,198 hours of education with the children. Early Head Start is a home-based program for pregnant moms and children birth to three-years-old. They come to you! They do weekly home visits with children & families. Screenings for health and development are completed on each child. Activities are planned around your child's development. Each month the home visitor brings a nutrition experience for you and your child to try. WEATHERIZATION **PROGRAM**

Weatherization had 8 homes completed and 2 deferrals in May, totaling \$112,000. Kalyn Olson joined the team as a WAP Specialist. Kalyn will start out working on the crews, learning the ropes of what Weatherization does to make homes more energy efficient and will then begin training to evaluate homes and use the various tools for Energy Auditing. Welcome Kalyn! The Crews have been working hard. The last few homes with final inspections had reduced air movement by more than half. Outstanding work, Weatherization!

EARL PUBLIC TRANSIT

In the month of May, our Transit program welcomed 39 new riders, completed 5,298 trips, and covered 46,601 service miles. Transit is also excited to announce that Lansing Bridge shuttles are now running six days a week!
