Weatherization completed one home in November and drew down approximately \$58,000 in funds. Crews adjusted schedules around winter weather, shifting between indoor and outdoor work as conditions allowed. Contractor completions slowed due to extreme cold and a high volume of furnace calls.

EARL Public Transit provided 4,518 rides throughout November. These trips included 1,570 Day Habilitation rides, 1,131 Education rides, 499 Work rides, and 230 Dialysis rides.



Family Development & Self Sufficiency (FaDSS Program)

FaDSS' FY25 Annual Report was recently released. NEICAC's FaDSS program supported 57 families, maintaining an average monthly capacity of 101%, which is above the statewide average. 14 families exited the program. At program exit, 79% of adults were employed (up from 57% at entry), and employed families saw an average monthly wage increase of \$1,263. Sixty-four percent of families exited with increased income, outperforming both the statewide target and statewide average. Families experiencing significant barriers received strong support: 100% of adults with substantiated mental health, substance use, or domestic violence concerns accessed treatment or assistance. Collectively, this data reflects the powerful impact of the individualized coaching, goal-focused, and strength-based support provided by our FaDSS program throughout FY25.



Child & Adult Food Care Program

In November, the CACFP program shared resources with providers, including a <u>World Kindness Day activity sheet</u> from the National CACFP Association, celebrating World Kindness day on Nov. 13. They also shared a seasonal recipe for <u>Cranberry Applesauce</u>, a fun twist on traditional applesauce that pairs well with fall and winter meals.

In addition, Transit operated a special shuttle service for Helping Services during the opening night of the Christmas Lights Walk-Through. The shuttle transported 770 riders and covered 30 miles, quite a number of trips back and forth between the campground and the soccer field!
